*Approval of Minutes

The draft minutes from the September 18, 2024, Executive Board Meeting was provided as part of the meeting packet.

The Chair called for a motion. A motion was made to approve the draft minutes by Ronnie Nessler (Nassau County). A second was made by Dave Chapman (Hospitals). Motion carries.

FINANCIAL

*Budget Report

The finance report for September and October 2024 were presented by Leigh Wilsey.

The Chair called for a motion. A motion was made to approve the financial report by Ronnie Nessler (Nassau County). A second was made by Dave Chapman (Hospitals). Motion carries.

Management and Administration

New Contract and Amendment (FY24-25)

Staff reviewed the new contract with the Florida Department of Health. The contract is for level-funding (\$748,712), and is a one-year, renewable contract. The current contract is a continuation of last year's contract and are awaiting final execution of the contract amendment received in mid-October. Staff report the amendment provided clarity on this year's deliverables and provided an extension of specific deliverable deadlines from December 15 to January 15.

Overview of Specialty Working Group Meeting

Staff shared the Region 3 HCC Alliance Specialty Working Group on Regional Resources and Gaps met on October 29, 2024. Staff reminded meeting attendees this is the working group that is reviewing the HVA and will then discuss and develop regional project ideas to bridge gaps within the region.

The next working group meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, December 3 at 10:00 AM.

BUSINESS

*Approval of General Membership Requests

As required in the bylaws, the Board must approve all membership requests. There have been thirteen (13) membership requests since the last meeting. The list was provided in the meeting packet.

The Chair called for a motion. A motion was made by Ronnie Nessler (Nassau County) to approve the new members. A second was made by Dave Chapman (Hospitals). Motion carries.

Introduce New Board Representatives: Long-Term Care

Staff share how two long-term care representatives stepped forward to represent their discipline on the NEFLHCC Board. The primary voting member is Jerry Lynn Daniels with Senior Living at The Greens, and the alternate representative is Evelena Dowling from River City Nursing & Rehab.

FHA Post-COVID Specialty Funding Opportunity

Staff shared there was a project funding opportunity up to \$100,000 offered through the Florida Hospital Association (FHA). The funding is the same as the previous FHA dollars the Alliance used to purchase infectious disease related equipment for hospitals. The application was put in for the full amount of \$100,000 for the purchase of PVC medical sleds. If awarded, staff will survey the hospitals in the region to distribute the equipment.

Sonny Rodgers with DOH – Clay shared how there are several PVC medical stretchers at Orange Park Medical Center and a county fire station.

Chair, Tim Devin, asked staff if there was a plan for the upcoming conference season. Staff shared they will work to see if EMAG is indeed downsizing and see if there are other beneficial conferences the HCC could sponsor members to attend.

TRAINING AND EXERCISE

BOLDPlanning Workshops

Staff shared that BOLDplanning and the Florida HCC's have launched the CEMP platform which

is free and available to any HCC member in Florida. Below are the Florida HCC funded virtual workshops. More CEMP and COOP workshops to come this fiscal year. The flyer with registration links is attached to the minutes.

CDP Virtual Training Offerings

Staff share the upcoming virtual training opportunities offered to anyone in Florida through the Center for Domestic Preparedness. Trainings include: Autism Awareness for Emergency Services, Patient Management: Receiving a Highly Infectious Disease Patient, and Patient Management: Management of a Highly Infectious Disease Patient in a Healthcare Facility. The flyer with more course information and registration links is attached to the minutes.

MRSE

The Medical Response and Surge Exercise (MRSE) is an annual requirement and is designed to test the region's capability and capacity to manage and support a surge of patients equal to at least 10% of their licensed general medical/surgical bed capacity. The exercise will be held in the Northeast region this fiscal year. Planning meetings will start in March, and the exercise will take place in May of 2025.

A survey will be sent to area hospitals and partners to garner participation interest.

*Staff shared with meeting attendees that after the RFQ process, All Clear Emergency Management Group was selected to provide virtual tabletop exercises for this fiscal year. This is the same vendor the Coalition has used previously, and members report how beneficial their delivery. Exercises are to start in late January, and there will be three exercise scenarios offered twice through the end of the fiscal year.

OPEN DISCUSSION

- Hospitals –Mr. Dave Chapman shared the next FCDC meeting is tomorrow, Thursday, November 21 at 10am. Shared Joint Commission has been in the area the past few weeks and expects to be surveyed soon.
- Public Health –

Ms. Freda Vaughn (RERA) shared that the Bureau of Preparedness and Response continue to work on merging the regional roles, as the DOH boundaries have adjusted to the DEM boundaries.

Mr. Ronnie Nessler from Nassau County shared that DEP will be taking over environmental services from the local health departments.

Mr. Sonny Rodgers from Clay County shared they are working with the consortiums to bring training once a quarter for the next three years. Developing and implementing a responder deployment full-scale exercise to prepare 10-15 personnel on mobilization and de-mobilization

during an emergency. Shared the regional special needs trainer will be providing staff training soon to get ahead of next hurricane season. Mr. Rodgers shared DOH will be hosting their state IPPW in January, and that DOH Clay had their special project approved to purchase special needs sheltering equipment.

Chair Devin added how helpful DOH Clay was during hurricane season in working in coordination with Baker County and Baptist Health.

Ms. Katie Jones from Duval County shared they will be hosting MGT-319 in January.

Ms. Jaffy Lee from Flagler County shared they have moved office spaces and have hired a new RN who will be involved in the EM program and SpNS training.

- EMS Mr. Kevin Kotsis shared the major focus of the state is on pre-natal and natal care. Shared Pulsara continues to be pushed, and many agencies across the state have adopted it. St. Johns County Fire Rescue plans to implement it by December but are the only agency in the region doing so. Shared how three area hospitals will be equipped to work with Pulsara in light of SJCFR adopting it. Additionally, the matching grant rules are changing, and state licensing is delayed. Lastly, there is a large push for each hospital to have a pediatric champion.
- Emergency Management Mr. Tim Devin with Clay County Emergency Management shared there is nothing major to report, and they are still in the recovery process from hurricane season.
- Home Health Nothing to report.
- Long-Term Care Nothing to report.
